



Prof. Bidyut Chakrabarty will speak on

"How to conceptualize Gandhi?"

2nd October 2020, Friday, 2:00 pm

India is commemorating the 150th birth aniversary of its great leader Mahatma Gandhi. Gandhi was a visionary who dreamt of a society free of caste, religious, economic and gender prejudices and his messages indeed transcend time and space. It is an occasion to remember them and translate them in our everyday practice.

Social Work draws heavily from Gandhian values and principles. It is time to revisit and re-emphasise these principles. Accordingly, Department of Social Work, University of Delhi is holding a series of international webinars on Gandhian Thoughts and Social Work Practice during the month of September 2020. Faculties, researchers and students of the Departments of Social Work from India and abroad, members of various NGOs and all those interested in the theme are invited to participate in these events.

Professor Bidyut Chakrabarty has been formerly a Professor of Political Science at University of Delhi. A Doctorate from the prestigious London School of Economics, UK, he has been a prolific writer, with many books, published by globally-reputed publishers. He is an authority in Public Administration and is widely cited for his original contributions to Mahatma Gandhi's social and political thoughts. His book 'Confluence of Thought: Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi and Martin Luther King' is a widely-appreciated text among his many other academic contributions. As an acclaimed academic, Professor Bidyut Chakrabarty has also held various academic assignments in many prominent universities across the globe. In addition to being the Visiting Professor in the UK, Australia and Singapore, he is the first occupant of the 'Mahatma Gandhi Chair for Global Nonviolence' at James Madison University, Virginia, USA.
